

1	Clinical Care: Specialised services to maintain or regain functional and/or cognitive capabilities	Nursing, most allied health, nutrition, care management and restorative care management
2	Independence: Support to manage activities of daily living and loss of skills or function to live independently	Personal care, social support & community engagement, therapeutic services, respite, transport, assistive technology
3	Everyday Living: Support to keep your home in a liveable state and support your independence at home	Domestic assistance, home maintenance & repairs, meals

Income and assets assessment outcome	Service category clinical support	Service category independence	Service category everyday living
Full pensioner	0%	5%	17.5%
Part pensioner and self-funder CHSC holder	0%	Between 5% and 50%*	Between 17.5% and 80%*
Self-funder non-CHSC holder and means not disclosed^	0%	50%	80%

- * Contributions will be applied on a tapered rate based on the participant's income and assets assessment.
- ^ A self-funded non-CSHC holder is an individual who is ineligible for the pension and the CSHC. A means not disclosed status refers to an individual who has not disclosed their assets and income.

No worse off principle

For participant contributions, a no worse off principle applies for grandfathered HCP recipients who, on 12 September 2024, were either receiving a Home Care Package, on the National Priority System, or assessed as eligible for a package. These participants will make the same contributions, or lower, than they would have had under HCP program arrangements, even if they are re-assessed into a higher Support at Home classification at a later date.
